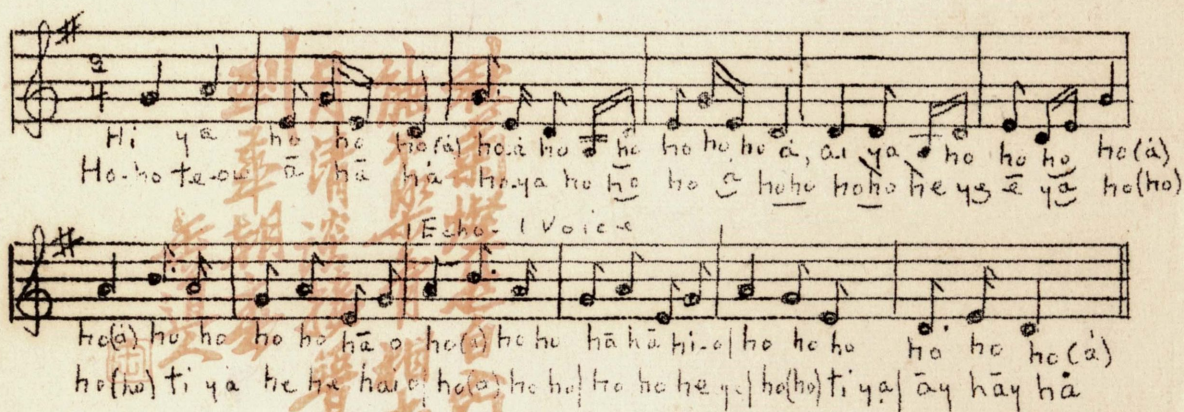


Stone Carriers Chorus - Kuling



Kuling Sept. 3. 1935

Nearly all of our neighbors have gone and because of rain today the stone cutters are quit. Some birds are calling their beautiful vesper songs. It is so quiet and peaceful and God is near. He does seem so near here in the stars and sun and the many beautiful living things all about. I am trying earnestly to learn more of Him and to be conscious of His faintest whisper. May He be better able to use me for Himself this coming year. We are facing the effects of cuts in money and of floods and other serious troubles but are going to trust God harder than ever. I hope and go forward to real victories. There will be many problems but we are not afraid when we meet them in Him and He in us.

The color in the sky now is becoming glorious because there are clouds against which the sun shines.
